



Lower taxes deliver lower electric bills

OGE Arkansas customers to see approximately \$113 in savings on upcoming electric bills

OKLAHOMA CITY— OGE today announced that its average Arkansas residential customer will see approximately \$113 in savings on upcoming electric bills.

In October, customers will see a credit of approximately \$57 on their electric bill. Then, beginning in November, customers will see a credit of approximately \$4 per month through the end of 2019. The savings are made possible by the reduction in corporate tax rates approved by Congress and signed by President Trump in December 2017.

"We're pleased to pass on to our customers the benefits of tax savings that resulted from the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act," said OGE spokesman Brian Alford.

The credit will be noted on October bills as "Tax Cuts and Jobs Act Credit."
