


OG&E reads to 885 students virtually during MLK Week of Service

OKLAHOMA CITY (Jan. 18, 2022) - For the second year in a row, OG&E is observing a Week of Service by partnering with 44 classrooms in 29 schools across its service area to share the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with 885 students.

During the 2022 MLK Week of Service, Jan. 16-23, 90 OG&E employee volunteers will read virtually to first graders across the OG&E service area. This year, employees and students will share in "Martin Luther King Jr.," written by Maria Isabel Sanchez Vegara.
