As a member of the National Honors Society, Mu Alpha Theta, Fellowship of Christian Athletes and the Van Buren High School Pointer Prancer Dance Team, as well as volunteering countless hours through dance and church, she displayed her commitment to leadership, scholarship and community involvement.

"College is a significant financial investment and the overall cost can be overwhelming for a young student. Our hope is that a scholarship of this size will allow Lilly to focus on her academic career," said Eddie Lee Herndon, OG&E Community Affairs Manager in western Arkansas and eastern Oklahoma. "We look forward to following Lilly's success and will be there to cheer her on along the way."

Through the Oklahoma City Community Foundation, the OGE Positive Energy Scholarship was established in 2019, focusing on students with high academic achievement who plan to pursue careers in an energy-related field and in need of financial aid. Eligible students must meet specific criteria to be considered, including:

- Be a graduating high school senior from the OG&E service area,
- Attend a college in the states of Oklahoma or Arkansas,
- Have an unweighted GPA greater than or equal to 3.25, and
- Achieve an ACT score of greater than or equal to 25 and/or SAT score greater than or equal to 1200.

"We value our partnership with the OGE Energy Corp. Foundation and are proud to collaborate on this scholarship program," said Nancy Anthony, president of the Oklahoma City Community Foundation. "Support for youth and education in our communities is at the core of both our organizations' values, and we are grateful to have the opportunity to help make higher education accessible to such well-deserving students through the OG&E scholarship program."

Since 2016, OGE Energy Corp. has provided more than \$1.9 million in scholarships for students in the OG&E service area.
